

#### **BEING A PARISH COUNCILLOR**

#### What is a councillor?

Councillors are elected to represent the entire Parish or Town Council area. They are generally elected by the public every four years.

#### What do councillors do?

Councillors have three main components to their work.

- 1. Decision making Through meetings and attending committees with other elected members, councillors decide which activities to support, where money should be spent, what services should be delivered and what policies should be implemented.
- 2. Monitoring Councillors make sure that their decisions lead to efficient and effective services by keeping an eye on how well things are working.
- 3. Getting involved locally As local representatives, councillors have responsibilities towards their constituents and local organisations. These responsibilities and duties often depend on what the councillor wants to achieve, how much time is available, and may include:

Going to meetings of local organisations
Going to meetings of bodies affecting the wider community
Taking up issues on behalf of the general public
Running a surgery for residents to bring up local issues
Meeting with individual constituents in their own homes

Attending a meeting of Northwood Parish Council (held in Northwood primary school on the first Tuesday of every month) or speaking to any of the Parish councillors, or clerk, is the best way to see what happens there.

#### How much time does it take up?

Quite often councillors say that their duties occupy them for about two to three hours a week, but obviously some may spend a lot more than this and others less. In the main, being a councillor is an enjoyable way of contributing to your local community, and in making it a better place to live and work. Various training sessions (including those on the responsibilities and duties of a councillor, and the Code of Conduct) are organised by the IW Association of Local Councils, and are highly recommended.

#### What does the Parish Council do?

The Parish Council is that part of local government closest to the people. They serve the smallest area and are responsible for the most local of matters. Very importantly, the Parish Council can 'precept' - raising a sum collected with the council tax each year to improve facilities and services for local people.

Parish councils have a number of basic responsibilities in making the lives of local communities more comfortable. Essentially these powers fall within three main categories; representing the whole electorate within the parish, delivering services to meet local needs, and striving to improve quality of life within the parish.

Parish councils also comment on planning applications - they are statutory consultees (they have to be consulted if they so wish) and can be represented at Public Enquiries.

#### **NORTHWOOD ALLOTMENT ASSOCIATION**

As most Northwood News readers will know, in March 2009, after some considerable amount of work by the Parish Council, a site for 20 allotments was opened on Newport Road. By May, all allotments were leased and being enthusiastically worked. During the season new friendships were made, the site was a hive of happy activity and was a source of fine fresh vegetables. Unfortunately for all concerned the site flooded quite spectacularly in the winter, first the site flooded and ducks found a new home there, then it froze over – and froze out the ducks and the allotment holders for the rest of the year. The land owner then decided that the lease would not be extended beyond September 2010 – bad news for all.

However, the story has a happy ending. A new site was found at Lower Luton Farm, Pallance Lane, and the Northwood Allotment Association (NAA) was formed – largely thanks to the energy and enthusiasm of Paul Morris, the new association Chairman. While the NAA is independent of the Parish Council it acknowledges a debt of gratitude to them for setting the process in motion.

At the new site there are 30 allotments all actively and happily being worked and there is a waiting list. Northwood Primary School has one of the plots and we look forward to seeing the results of their activity in the spring. Look out for NAA news periodically in Northwood News. We will certainly have an Open Day in spring 2011 and look forward to showing interested visitors around the site.

## **REPORT - DECEMBER 2010 / JANUARY 2011 COUNCIL BUDGET 2011 / 2012**

Residents will of course be aware that following last year's General Election and the formation of the Coalition Government, a Comprehensive Spending Review has been published highlighting the state of the nation's finances.

This has shown the huge multi-billion pound national debt and the high cost of repaying that debt which falls on every taxpayer in the country including those who will have to pay tax in the future, i.e. your children and grandchildren. Whilst such future liability has ever been thus the present scale of national debt is unprecedented in modern times.

So the Government has announced a massive curtailment in public expenditure over the next four years in a bid to not only hugely reduce that debt but also to keep the interest we pay on that debt as low as possible.

This can only be done by initially making relatively short term, i.e. four year plans to reduce public spending whilst maintaining those services most vital to public need and keeping interest rates as low as possible to help industry expand, thus preserving and creating private sector employment and assisting families with mortgages in these difficult times. In addition, old age pensions increases have to be considered and made.

Many of these public sector cuts have been, as expected, targeted at local authorities whose increasing public sector role over the last decade or more has been a feature of public life in this country. So much so, many believe that this has led to Councils being seen as a first point of call for almost anything with the widely held view that "the Council should do this".

That perception has to be addressed because the money is no longer available to fund local Councils at those previous levels. The Isle of Wight Council expects to have to make large spending reductions over the next four years commencing with the budget for the fiscal year 1st April 2011 to the 31st March 2012.

The Government has indicated that the Council will need to find savings of at least £32 million during those four years with at least £17 million of those to > be made in that first year. That will represent a 26% reduction in Government funding.

We are now engaged in that difficult process, the preliminary scope of which will be outlined at the Council's Cabinet meeting on the 7th December, the public papers for which will be available online at iwight.com for the end of November.

The national finances mean that all Council expenditure will be under review including services to schools, the elderly, libraries, leisure, public transport, housing, refuse collections and staffing at all levels. This will result in a number of very painful choices having to be made to balance the books.

As the former Chief Secretary to the Treasury said in his note to his Coalition Government successor, "There is no money left". Whilst this was not literally true, what it did mean was that too much money had been spent in the past to the extent that there was none available to continue spending at past high levels.

The Council has and continues to consult widely on these difficult spending decisions and I would be pleased to hear from residents with their views. As the Cabinet Member for Adult Social Care and Housing, I am well aware of the importance of those services to Island residents but the time has come when all these service levels have to be reviewed. This is not something either myself or my colleagues take lightly and I must tell you that the responsibility for this weighs heavily on my mind.

However, we are faced with little choice in terms of having to make these spending reductions because the Council is not allowed by law to pass a deficit budget. This means that with less money to spend, we will simply not be able to provide the same level of services as in previous years. Whilst every effort will be made to maintain as many services as possible, even with what may well need to be substantial staffing reductions, services will be reduced from next year.

I hope residents will understand the difficult position we will all face over the next few years and that unless this debt problem is fully addressed now, the nation's finances will only continue to spiral downwards into an even higher level of national debt leading to even higher levels of interest rates leading in turn to even higher levels of eventual public spending reductions. You do not need a degree in economics to see the inevitability of that scenario.

In the meantime, all is not doom and gloom and we will do our very best to ensure that core services are protected and that appropriate safety nets are put in place to assist the most vulnerable of our residents whilst at the same time actually not increasing next year's rate of Council Tax.

Jill and myself send our usual sincere seasonal greetings to all residents with our best wishes for the new year.

write this article in the week it has been announced that Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II has signed up to Facebook. Facebook is a social network service and website launched in February 2004. As of July 2010 Facebook had more than 500 million active users, a number which will have increased considerably by now. Users may create a personal profile, add other users as friends and exchange messages, although I understand that we shall not be allowed to sign up as a friend of Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II!

This news started me thinking about the whole subject of communication. We have so many different methods in this twenty-first century. Whether out of choice or ability not all of us will use every communication aid available. How different, though, are the ways and means of announcing news to our families and friends now to the way in which it was announced even just one hundred years ago. When we watch some of the period dramas on television we see, very often, a single sheet of paper being hand-delivered containing the news of some event which took place several days ago. Now we can immediately pick up the telephone, landline or mobile, to speak out the news as it happens. Alternatively we can text the news or even send an e-mail from our mobile telephone whilst on the move. Some of us become a little overwhelmed by such technology and perhaps we think it might be nicer to return to the days of long ago of simple but belated messages.

The Christmas Story of the nativity of the Lord Jesus Christ was shrouded in communication. God had an enormous task in letting everyone know of the birth of His Son, our Lord and Saviour, Jesus Christ. No mobile telephones or e-mails for Him! Firstly God wanted to communicate with his people to tell them the Good News of a Saviour who would be born. To do this he used some of his servants in their role as prophets. We are often reminded of this in Christmas Carol Services when a bible reading is taken from the prophet Isaiah in which verse six says, "For to us a child is born, to us a son is given, ... he will be called Wonderful Counsellor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father, Prince of Peace."

How then, did God communicate His message when Christ was actually born in a rough stable in Bethlehem, surrounded by animals and without modern technology? God did it in a way which for me was far more wonderful than a page on Facebook. He used a great company of angels, humble shepherds and eastern kings known as Magi. Imagine those shepherds in a field in Bethlehem receiving the news of the Saviour's birth not just from one angel but as the gospel of Luke tells us, "Suddenly a great company of the heavenly host appeared with the angel, praising God and saying, 'Glory to God in the highest, and on earth peace to men on whom his favour rests.'"

I think those shepherds originally became overwhelmed not by technology, but by the amazing way in which God communicated to them the great news of the birth of Jesus Christ, the Saviour of the World.
