future, but noted that the need was debatable since there had been no attendance to date.

COMMUNITY TRANSPORT SCHEME

Many thanks to all those who have responded by expressing their concerns about losing the bus service.

The Northwood, Cowes & Gurnard Community Transport Forum met again on 3rd February, and apart from an update on actions taken since the 13/1/11 meeting most of the meeting was spent talking to 2 representatives from Southern Vectis who had heard about the Forum and were keen to see how far we had progressed.

The current Wightbus service apparently only covers about 50% of its costs. Southern Vectis is keen to work with the Forum to find a way forward, and to assist with providing a service that would complement and feed into the No 1 route/service from the outlying areas.

The company has buses available due to having 35 of the 60 buses involved with school runs lying idle between the 2 school run times and would have no problem supplying a service similar to that which is already being provided by Wightbus, with a view to combining the 30 & 32 in one route/service, and may even be able to extend the current provision.

The service can only be viable if volunteer drivers could be found - the company has no desire to make huge profits, just to cover all costs. It was explained that there are great PR opportunities in providing a combined Southern Vectis and Community Bus Scheme – it would be a 1st nationally! He would also be prepared to train drivers up to PCV licence qualification (Passenger Carrying Vehicle) free of charge, providing a commitment was given to complete the course, and the buses on the route would be "branded" to recognise the Parish Councils and Communities involved. Concessionary fares should also be able to be included. It is envisaged there would be 6 weekly shifts for the drivers.

So, to summarise:

We need at least 6 volunteer drivers from the community

Southern Vectis will train the drivers up to gaining their PCV licences

Privers must be able to pass a medical

Once the drivers are trained, Southern Vectis says there may be opportunities for those drivers, if they wished, to take on the occasional shift for Southern Vectis, for which they would be paid.

So, this plea is to everyone - spread the word and try and find some volunteers for this project. You might think this is impossible, but actually those involved

BIRD FAECES (Colin Cramp Tel: 01983 289996)

A Northwood resident has spoken to me about bird faeces on the windows, etc. of their house, and on their car. Please do not feed seagulls and other large birds such as pigeons as this can lead to the problems listed below. Please feed the small birds by, for example, using a dispenser.

Health issues - infection from the faeces;

Feeding will attract other vermin such as rats and mice;

Faeces has been proved to eat into paintwork on vehicles and buildings;

Seagulls will swoop and attack humans in their quest for food;

Seagulls will kill other small garden birds, detrimental to the smaller birds' survival:

The nuisance may incite neighbour hostilities

WILDLIFE HABITAT (or birds in the garden) - Cllr Pat Bentley

In support of Colin Cramp's article above, I would like to add a few pointers to creating a bird friendly habitat in the garden. The main problem is the dominance of larger species (corvids, pigeons etc.) who will not only eat all the food you put out, but also take both eggs and young of smaller birds. Rather than put food out directly, a far better option is to encourage the provision of hedges planted with fruiting species, providing habitat for insects. They also provide excellent opportunities for nesting, allowing the gradual build-up of a healthy local population.

ne of our grandsons is studying Romeo and Juliet in English Literature. As part of his work he has to express Shakespeare's language in today's English. When I saw him recently he'd found a website that translated the work and he was enjoying reading and I read recently that there are probably around a million English words and phrases that come down to us from various sources and it is changing all the time. When did we first start the new use of old words icon, mouse, In 1611, the year that King James's Bible (also known as the Authorised Version) was published, Shakespeare began work on his last play, The Tempest. Shakespeare stretched the lexicon of English words to the very limit of his brain, using a vocabulary of 30,000 words. The translators of the King James Bible (and there was quite a team), seeking to turn ancient documents in ancient languages into poetic prose that would be read to. and increasingly by, ordinary people, used a vocabulary of a mere 8,000 www.northwoodvillage.org.uk for English words, with phrases that have entered deep into this worldwide, common tongue ("good Samaritan", "by the skin of your teeth", "no peace Apparently it was always the intention of the translators that their version should evolve linguistically (Cranmer, by the way, had the same view I value reading the Bible in different translations and one of the resources I One of God's gifts to us in creation is to give us brains which are wired for speech, not just a practical, grunting kind of speech, but all the wonderful ways that human linguistic creativity has spoken in poetry and drama, in laws and ecstatic song, in Iullabies and slang. In the beginning God ... spoke; in the beginning was the Word. And the Bible, the Authorised Version and all its successors, has been translated again and again into the daily speech of millions of people in thousands of languages. It, too, is filled with song and parable, history and poetry, allegory and dream, prophecy, law and apocalyptic vision, biography and letters. It is indeed To quote from Psalm 150: Praise the Lord! ISLAND LIBRARIES

Further to my report last month, the consultation period on libraries has now ended with a very gratifying total response. This consultation was about a model of future operation that was considered practical by our professional libraries management and that would make a significant contributory saving to the overall Council requirement to reduce Council expenditure by up to £32m in the next four vears.

These responses have ranged from "make no change to the present library service" to positive encouragement for greater community involvement. To assist the process of the core libraries in Sandown, Ventnor, Freshwater and Cowes moving more easily towards the introduction of cooperative IW Council and community library service model, the Council proposes extending the hours of operation for these sites to 21 hours per week.

All of these libraries will continue to be fully supported by the Council's central library service which will include free training for volunteers prepared to assist in these libraries during usual opening and indeed what we hope will be extended opening hours.

It is my intention to volunteer to be trained for this most interesting and worthwhile purpose and I would welcome hearing from any others who feel the same.

Whilst Newport Library, which I know is popular with many local residents, continues to be the main library for our area I am hoping that with enhanced community involvement we will increase the number of regular Cowes library users.

In the meantime, Cowes Town Council has set up a Working Party to see how it might assist in any community involvement with Cowes Library. I expect to have further news about this in my next report.

WIGHTBUS SERVICES 30 and 32

I am pleased to confirm the excellent work of the Joint Working Party between Northwood and Gurnard Parish Councils which has met with Southern Vectis to see if replacement services for our local Wightbus can be agreed.

I understand Parish Chairman John Pullen will be updating more fully on this matter in his Parish Report but I am most heartened by certain positive news emanating from that Working Party.
