The start of the Six Nations Rugby tournament (hurrah!)? The last month of winter? Lengthening days? Spring around the corner? Groundhog Day? For those of you who don't know what Groundhog Day is - it is a crazy American tradition where a groundhog's behaviour allegedly predicts the weather (mad concept but it was made into a brilliant film - watch it if you haven't seen it!)

for the latest local news and However I am sure many of you, with or without sighs, said somewhere in your list Valentine's Day. Yes, whether you like it or not, the world is taken over by shops and the media forcing Valentine's Day upon us - a time when those of us in a relationship are obliged/encouraged/forced to show our other halves how much they are loved (should this not be happening more than one day a year?) and those who are single or widowed feel even more alone. I am not a fan of Valentine's Day, as you may have gathered: there is way too much commercialism for one day when we should be showing love and care all the time and to everyone, not just one particular person in our life on one specific day, but who am I to say? I will move on before I am tempted to get on my soap box!

Visit the village website: www.northwoodvillage.org.uk The church also celebrates St Valentine's Day but amusingly it has nothing to do with lovers! The Church of England commemorates a martyr called Valentine – a priest from Terni and was killed in Rome around 269. Not very romantic at all! The link with the celebration of lovers might be associated with a pagan festival in Rome connected to fertility but then others say that 'valentine' and 'love' was only later connected together by Chaucer. Whatever the origins, for Christians, this day also marks an acknowledgement of an all loving God who blesses those who love one another, as Jesus implored his own disciples to do. So perhaps we shouldn't have just bought that one card for our beloveds but one for each member of the congregation! Good lord, what am I saying, I'm encouraging even more commercialism!

Normally lent starts in February but this year Easter is so late that it doesn't start until March. I was asked last year why Easter moves so much: The reason is that the early church fathers wished to keep the observance of Easter in correlation to the Jewish Passover. Because the death, burial, and resurrection of Jesus happened after the Passover, they wanted Easter to always be celebrated subsequent to the Passover. Since the Jewish holiday calendar is based on solar and lunar cycles, each feast day is movable, with dates shifting from year to year. So, in Western Christianity, Easter is always celebrated on the Sunday immediately following the Paschal Full Moon.

To add to the complication the date of the Paschal Full Moon is not set by lunar events but from historical tables. It isn't a simple answer but this is as short an explanation as I could make it with all the information included......if you want further detail or a better explanation, ask Archdeacon Peter Sutton next time you see him!!!

However one festival that the church celebrates which is always in February is Candlemas. This is a Christian festival celebrated annually on February 2 when we commemorate 40 days after Jesus' birth when Mary and Joseph took him to the Temple. Mary had observed the traditional period of purification (of mothers) following the birth of a son. According to a New Testament gospel, during this visitation a Jewish man named Simeon held the baby Jesus in his arms and said that he would be 'a light for the nations'. This image of Christ as the light has led to the celebration of light countering darkness and it is for this reason that this festival is called Candlemas.

2014 has surely washed in with a vengeance, the whole Country

suffering from relentless flooding: even high ground in Northwood being flooded and needing to call on the ever supportive fire brigade. I was travelling back from London on the Mondav before Christmas, and it took us 7hrs on the train, 12hrs to get home, drenched, but we considered ourselves lucky to get home at all. It will be a winter never to be forgotten.

You will have seen how the infrastructure is straining to cope. The drains that have consistently flooded down Pallance Road, because they are collapsed or root filled, are beyond repair and cannot cope, so we have to wait for their renewal to come into program, meanwhile, we suffer damage to the road surface - and we have got off lightly!

In general, we are a pretty contended parish, and, as such, we are full of good souls who look out for each other, and it is about time we gave some public recognition and thanks for this and all those good souls that make our community. Talking about community, the new Travellers Joy remains as a thriving community pub, with a reputation for excellent good food and a place for clam, if not diverse, discourse spreading fast. It is nice, too, to be able to see Derek and Ruth frequenting the place, relaxing and enjoying themselves. Derek still runs the ever popular guiz on Sunday evenings. The Horseshoe, too, remains a popular venue, with many people hovering between the two.

You may or may not know, but I succeeded in getting a unanimous vote on a Motion that I proposed at November Full Council. It was, basically, to actively promote our excellent Island products whenever there is a hospitality event. The IW Council don't really do those nowadays, but, the recognition is there. To be honest, my main focus was to promote and include Island beer, instead of the chemical rubbish and foreign bland products that get tabled at these events (there's a surprise, I can hear some of you say!), and, in fairness, the intent was broadened to be, rightly, more inclusive. Impact was immediate and is building up momentum, with the Island MP taking up the case, the County Press writing an excellent article to promote the excellence of Island pubs, and the principal now filtering down to Wards, Parishes, businesses and local community.

Motions that I had deferred to January Full Council are for constructive inclusivity of Complementary and Alternative Medicine (CAM) in our Island Health and Wellbeing, and better communication, understanding and involvement with the Police, who are facing £25m cuts and more. Response, so far has been good, and I am hoping that these Motions with take-off in the same war as the Beer Motion, as their potential impact and benefit is far-reaching.

Just a final note, please do bear in mind any neighbour that you know who might struggle, especially in adverse conditions. A kindly word or deed very often costs nothing, can make you feel good and very often makes a significant difference to someone else.

PCSO Lisa Paul presented the report of the Local Safety Neighbourhood (LSN) team, on events that had taken place since the last meeting. Particular mention was made of the following:

The Speed Watch, which had taken place on December 18th in Pallance Road and other local areas A couple of vehicles had been recorded of INEWS just exceeding the speed limit, but none were sufficient to warrant a letter of caution being sent. A further event was held last month outside of the Travellers Joy. Councillors noted that a similar exercise conducted along Rew Street, Gurnard resulted in 7 or 8 letters being sent out to speeding drivers. Speed Watch was a continuing exercise with three more dates planned in the Gurnard/Northwood areas.
