Neighbourhood Watch Report (Cllr Pullen, 01983 281250)

It has been another quiet period for reported crime. Some wheel trims were taken from a vehicle in Nodes Road between 10th and 14th January. Anyone with any information should contact the Police.

The Cowes Safer Neighbourhoods Police Team is conducting a Street Mapping exercise in Northwood over the next few months. A questionnaire is delivered to each household on which villagers can list their concerns. The responses will enable the Police to identify the main areas of concern in the village and hopefully address them.

During the recent cold spell it was nice to see people helping each other with snow clearance and collecting of food and prescriptions. Maybe this is something that, in the event of bad weather, we could put on a more organised structure in the future. Any useful thoughts on this to myself or any Parish Councillor please.

No Cold Calling

The incidents of reported Cold Calling have declined considerably since the start of the scheme. A big 'thank you' to those villagers who have made callers aware of the scheme and have reported incidents to me or Trading Standards. I have a small supply of No Cold Calling window stickers if anybody needs one. Please let me know of any incidents of people cold calling, or ring Trading Standards on 01983 823370.

Become a Composting Champion (Laura Kay, IWC)

Composting is an inexpensive, natural process that transforms your kitchen and garden waste into valuable, nutrient rich food for your garden. Composting at home for just one year can save global warming gases equivalent to all the CO² your kettle produces annually, or your washing machine produces in 3 months.

The Composting Champion scheme has been launched to train enthusiastic composters to spread the word about home composting within their local communities. Volunteers are given training and a resource kit along with support from the council's recycling team, and each other. The Composting Champions then use their knowledge and enthusiasm to answer queries, give advice, and encourage their local community in home composting, be it schools, church groups or their neighbours.

If you are interested in composting, and would like to be part of a team helping others to compost at home, you could be a Composting Champion. You don't need to have prior knowledge or even a compost bin, just enthusiasm and a little time. To become a Composting Champion, book your place on the free training day at Aldermoor Farm, Ryde on 6th March 2010.

NORTHWOOD COMMUNITY PARTNERSHIP REPORT

A reminder that the Village Trail is an entry in the 2010 Isle of Wight Walking Festival. The walk will be on Friday 14th May 2010, starting from the Horseshoe Pub at 10am. The distance will be 8 miles and is scheduled to take 3 hours to complete. The walk will be led by Paul Fuller.

This Project is a wonderful example of what can be done for our village. Why not try the walk for yourselves? Hopefully, we may have better weather by May 14th.

The replacement planters are now in position and fully planted. They were paid for and are consequently owned by Northwood Parish Council. They will be maintained by Partnership members. £100 for planting was also granted by the Parish Council.

Cllr Paul Fuller was nominated and has agreed to be the Parish Council's representative on the Community Partnership. He has always been a great supporter of all our Projects and is a most welcome addition.

The last new village 'gateway' sign is now in position, in Pallance Road, and so completes the entire project.

Further to previous requests for help in maintaining the village planters, it is a great pleasure to note that we have two further village residents offering assistance with the scheme. This now leaves 6 troughs needing 'adoption'. At the risk of sounding repetitious - villagers of any age are welcome. No great gardening skills required, just the wish to see our village continuing to look its best.

Cllr Roger Mazillius felt it necessary to resign from the Partnership to concentrate on his many other activities on behalf of Northwood. His input, over many years, has been very much appreciated. A sincere request is made for any other villager to fill this vacancy. Experience is not a requirement.

The Partnership unanimously agreed to support the Parish Council in its attempts to eradicate the very unwholesome degree of dog fouling. This is particularly prevalent around Venner Avenue Play Park and the pedestrian pathway from Venner Avenue to Newport Road. Jacqui Darby, our Environment & Neighbourhood Officer is very aware of this problem and is taking various actions, in partnership with the Dog Wardens, to apprehend these irresponsible dog owners.

Thanks are expressed to our ENO for the pavement edge grass trimming that has recently taken place throughout the village.

At the time of writing there is no news as to whether there will be funding from the Wight in Bloom' scheme. In common with most other voluntary organisations, Partnership funds are decreasing and accessing grants is harder to achieve. We have a wonderful village in which to live but there is a cost. If you wish to help your village, any and all ideas for fundraising are not just welcome, they are critical to the Partnership's continuing existence. You can submit your ideas either through the village website or by coming to the next Community Partnership meeting on Tuesday, 23rd March, 2010 starting at 7.45pm in the Northwood W.I. 've been looking back at previous parish magazine articles. Just under a year ago I shared with you that I was wrestling with the question of what the church is for. It's a question I'm still looking at - because I've come to understand that it's a question I have to live with and this side of the Second Coming will probably not be fully answered – but we do what we can with faith in Christ, not in the world.

Our present culture wants us to have goals, targets, measurable success (or failure) over specific time periods. That's not what the church is about. We're about God, Jesus Christ and the love that God has for his creation – you, me, this world. That's why I was encouraged by what the new Bishop of Portsmouth, Christopher Foster, has to say.

Bishop Christopher's appointment to our Diocese was announced on 9th February. Modern life being what it is, his appointment was announced on the Internet at 0730 that day and his first multimedia interview was at 0740. He had several other interviews during the day, some of which were fascinated by his revelation that he is a very committed Wolves supporter and is looking forward to being at Fratton Park when Pompey and Wolves next meet ...!

He comes with a lot of life experience - he's already an assistant Bishop in the St Alban's Diocese; he worked in teaching before he was ordained; his first wife died of cancer.

He came to Portsmouth and the Island on the day his appointment was announced and here are his thoughts about being a bishop and about being Christian. "I haven't got a manifesto," he said. "Being bishop involves discernment and waiting on God. In my first months, I'll look forward to discovering more about the Church here, and listening to others before we discern the way forward. And it won't be my way, but God's way forward. "All Christians should have some guiding characteristics, qualities that can be seen in individual's lives and in the life of the Church. I'd like to identify four.

"Firstly, Christians are called to be compassionate in their caring for other people. Secondly, they are called to share in what God is doing already in the world in his mission and ministry. Thirdly, Christians are called to encourage discipleship, to draw other people into the love of God. And fourthly, they stand for truth, for justice and for peace. I'd like to lead a Church with those qualities."

Do you find that exciting?

I do.

I think that we have to acknowledge the challenges that face us, to work out what we can do in response and to be realistic. I'm encouraged by the words of another bishop, Oscar Romero, who lived in South America. He wrote this:

"We plant the seeds that one day will grow. We water seeds already planted, knowing that they hold future promise. We lay foundations that will need further development. We provide yeast that produces far beyond our capabilities. We cannot do everything, and there is a sense of liberation in realizing that. This enables us to do something, and to do it very well. It may be incomplete, but it is a beginning, a step along the way, an opportunity for the Lord's grace to enter and do the rest."

We are now in the season of Lent, a time traditionally used to reflect and pray on how better we can serve God and the world. Are you able to make time to think and pray on what you would like the church to be and do at this time?

It is, after all, YOUR Council and you will recall that NONE of the original eight Councillors were ACTUALLY ELECTED because there were only seven nominations. So we had to co-opt one other to make up the number.

I only stood myself in case we did not get enough nominations. If we had got nine or more, I would have stood down in the five day window allowing me to do this before election arrangements were finalised because I wanted to see fresh faces inputting into this local level of democracy.

Even if you don't want to stand, you can give your practical support to village life, e.g. help with the plant tubs weeding and watering, help with our litter-picking Saturday mornings and a whole host of other parish activities (I won't list them all as I don't want to put anyone off!)

All you need to stand is to complete a couple of simple forms and two signatures of local residents. For further information about this and for the forms you can email clive.joynes@iow.gov.uk

Clive is the I.W. Council's highly regarded elections specialist. Get in early before he gets really busy with General Election work.

NEW ALDI STORE AT BAE SYSTEMS SITE

By the time you are reading this I expect this planning application to have been decided. The recommendation before the Planning Committee is for approval and I will be supporting that recommendation, as is the Parish Council. If granted I would expect the store to be in use from approx. this time next year or possibly a little earlier. UPDATE - APPLICATION APPROVED.

The application also seeks outline permission for light industrial and office use for the site with all the extra employment opportunities this will bring in future years. I will be pressing for appropriate highway and traffic management improvements as conditions for approval. I will be updating this report on the northwoodvillage.org.uk website in the Village Forum threads.

ALLOTMENTS

As many of you will have read in last week's County Press, our stay at the allotments will end after September. I am looking for another suitable site and would be grateful to be told if anyone knows of such an area of land we could use for this popular activity.

In the meantime may I express my thanks to all who have worked so hard to establish their growing plots on the existing site and to the owner of the site for all the facilities she kindly provided to make the allotments a viable proposition. The Parish Councillors are keen to see this activity continue within the village and we will I am sure do all we can to facilitate this for the future.

THE WOMEN'S WORLD DAY OF PRAYER

On Friday 5th March over 3 million people world-wide will be praying and worshipping together during an annual day of prayer, using a service prepared by Christian women in Cameroon.

Emma Wilcock, president of the National Committee of the Women's World Day of Prayer movement, said:

"This is always an exciting day as a great wave of prayer sweeps the world, beginning when the first service is held in the Queen Salote Girls' School in Tonga and continuing around the world until the final service takes place, some 35 hours later, in neighbouring Western Samoa. By then the day will have been celebrated in over 170 countries and over 5,000 services will have been held in the United Kingdom.

The Republic of Cameroon is said to be Africa in miniature. It is a country of great cultural diversity with more than 240 ethnic groups and languages. It faces many challenges as its people seek to move forward into a modern age without losing their distinctive characteristics. But at all times, in all circumstances, Cameroonians are able to praise God with joy and exuberance and the service reflects this."

In Cowes, this annual ecumenical service will take place at St Thomas of Canterbury RC Church at 11.00am on Friday 5th March. This year's speaker will be our own Archdeacon Caroline Baston. The service will be followed by a bring and share lunch; there will also be a Traidcraft stall. All, both men and women, are invited to join in this day of prayer.

REPORT - MARCH 2010 VILLAGE GREEN

Further to my last Roger's Report in Northwood News, I can confirm the agreed settlement terms were approved by the I.W. Council's General Purposes Committee last Thursday.

In brief, this granted "village green" status for the lower approx. two-fifths of the field - this is the area nearest to the Pallance Road footpath. Residents have the right to use THIS area for "lawful sports and pastimes" as they have done for the past twenty-plus years. The designation does not grant any rights additional to those historic ones, i.e. generally walking, dog-walking and exercising, flying kites, blackberrying, playing with children, etc.

In addition the landowners have agreed to grant a permissive walking right around the perimeter of the remaining land, i.e. along the back of the Pallance Road gardens and round the back of Harry Cheek Gardens to join up with the public footpath running from the Wyatts Lane footpath, down the fence to the bottom and then northwards to the Pallance Road footpath. None of this affects the public's existing rights over this registered public footpath.

A fence of a temporary nature will be erected to clearly show the division between the two areas of land. A gate will be installed in this to allow a two metre width pedestrian access along the Pallance Road gardens boundary as referred to above. The fence will stop before the edge of the existing public footpath. Residents are urged to use this access responsibly, as in past usage.

May I repeat my sincere thanks to all residents who supported my application.
