



One drug related incident that had come to light when a vehicle had been routinely stopped. The car was subsequently impounded as there had been no insurance in place. Two incidents of Anti-Social Behaviour. when a vehicle had been driven in an incorrect manner in the snow PCSO Oatley advised that with the lighter evenings it was usual for reported crime to see an increase. The LSN team were always on the alert and would monitor any incidents on a daily basis. Cllr Pullen expressed his thanks to the LSN team for their prompt response to the neighbourhood incident in Selman Gardens. The resident concerned was very grateful.

Provision of a Skip

The clerk read from a letter that she had sent to Mr Pimm in respect of his first matter of concern regarding the sweeping of Pallance Lane. Mr Marlton, the Cyclical Maintenance officer at the IW Council had advised that Pallance Lane was classified as rural, and was therefore included within the annual street cleansing schedule. However, following a couple of complaints, it was actually swept three times during the previous year. With regard to the second matter, the clerk had obtained a quotation for the supply of a skip, which ranged from £94 for a 2 yard to £198 for a 6 yard skip. Councillors expressed their sympathy to the suggestion, particularly for the non-car owner. However, it was unanimously agreed that the provision of skips was not a financially justifiable expense. The IW Council provided well run facilities at Lynbottom and at the recycling unit along the Forest Road for the disposal of any unwanted matter. These were open all year round for use by all Island residents. It was decided that the cost involved providing skips, could not be justified.

Research into Local Men who Died in WWI

The Council considered an email from Ms.J.Pearce. Ms Pearce was present and addressed the Parish Council on her suggestion for Northwood and Gurnard Parish Councils to consider continuing her research of the 48 local men who died in World War 1. Reference was made to instances where some community groups had decided to document the lives behind the names on local memorial plagues. The findings could then be made public in the centenary year of 2014, in the form of a small booklet or editorial on the village web-site.

The clerk cautioned councillors on their limited powers to fund the

proposal. There was no statutory power to cover the production of village history, only the use of Any expenditure had to be commensurate with the benefit to the local community, which in the current financial year limited the amount to £6.80 per person. It would therefore be necessary to pursue the availability of grant funding.

The Chairman advised that he would explore the suggestion with several of his contacts, to ascertain if they would be minded to undertake the proposed research. He would then prepare a report for the March meeting. In the meantime the clerk was requested to contact Gurnard Parish Council to seek their interest on the scheme.

Northwood in Bloom Working Party

Cllr Pullen advised that he intended to pay a visit to Ryde House Nurseries shortly to ascertain the summer planting available. The planting scheme would be reviewed to ensure only a small contingency remained after filling the tubs. There had been no information as to whether the Wight in Bloom funding was to continue. The clerk to forward to Cllr Pullen the total budget set for planting in 2013/4.

Parish Plan Working Party

Councillors expressed their gratitude to IW Cllr R Mazillius, Mr P Le Pen and Mr L Measures for their assistance in circulating and collecting the Parish Plan survey. A total of 1029 houses had been delivered to, with a return rate of approximately 50% anticipated. The one area still outstanding should be completed by the coming Friday. The next stage being the collation of the information remained to be resolved. The cost of hiring an external person would be prohibitive. The question was put to the clerk, if she was prepared to undertake the task outside of her normal contacted hours. Cllr Bentley had produced a proforma, which he had used to collate those forms he had collected. The matter will be on the agenda for the March meeting.

Five Admirals, a Colonel and Two Babies part 2

Memorials inside St John the Baptist Church, Northwood By Jacquie Pearce

Admiral *Sir Hugh Cloberry Christian (1747 – 1799) *Knight Companion of the Order of the Bath.

Hugh Christian's naval career appears to have been significantly more distinguished and successful than Samuel Osborne's although this may just reflect the accident of the survival of records. In that era it was common for the richest and grandest individuals to be buried inside the church rather than the churchyard. The more important you were, the nearer you would be buried nearer to the main altar, with the incumbent clergy naturally taking priority. Ann Christian must have been considered entitled to one of the superior positions by virtue of her husband's position with her memorial in the chancel area while Samuel Osborne had to be content with the south aisle.

(Information from Wikipedia). Born in Oxfordshire. His family originated from the Isle of Man. He followed his father into the Royal Navy gaining his first commission in 1771. In March 1775 he married Ann[e] Leigh of the Isle of Wight. He was promoted to master and commander and subsequently flag-captain in 1778 (aged 31). He saw action in several of the engagements during the American War of Independence. His commands included the 74 gun HMS Suffolk (1778-80), 38 gun Fortunee, a French frigate he had helped to capture (1780-83), (as second captain) Lord Howe's flagship the 100 gun Charlotte (1790, 1793-4) and finally 98 gun Prince George (1795), 90 gun HMS Glory (1795), HMS Thunderer (1795-6), 44 gun HMS Virginie (1797). He became admiral of the blue in 1795 when he was appointed commander-in-chief of the West Indies station, finally succeeding after two failed attempts in escorting a large troop convoy to the West Indies. There he assisted in the capture of Saint Lucia, Saint Vincent and Grenada. In 1797 he was advanced to rear-admiral of the white (equivalent to today's Vice-Admiral) and appointed second-in-command of the Cape of Good Hope, South Africa. He succeeded to the post of station commander in 1798 but died at the Cape in November aged only 51 (or, if one believes the memorial, 49). He had been created a peer, Lord Ronaldsway, to honour his Manx origins but unfortunately the letters of patent did not arrive before his death. Anne, his wife, had been seriously ill for some time and died shortly afterwards at the family home of West Hill (see below) without learning of her husband's death. They had two sons and three daughters. One of the sons became rear-admiral Hood Hanaway Christian.

And most

In the meantime, the serious issues raised in the recent Ofsted Report are being rigorously addressed by the Acting Head Teacher and his senior leadership colleagues with the full support of the Governors and Trustees. Council Budget 2013/14

I am pleased to confirm that for a third successive year the Council's Cabinet has approved a budget which will not require any increase in Council Tax. This will now be debated by the whole Council on 27th February and would I am sure be then finally approved. I am also pleased to confirm that this budget provides for an additional £8m of expenditure for adult social care over the next three years, taking the total increase if the current year is included to over £10m. All of this is against the continuing reduction in local government funding from central government.

Parking congestion in Venner Avenue by Playpark Bend

I have been concerned at the density of parked vehicles in this area, including those parking on part of the pavements. Residents have recently contacted me about this and the potential danger for motorists navigating through this narrow part of the road. I am taking advice from a highways engineer to see if anything can be done to alleviate this problem. Resident's views would as usual be most welcome.

Nuisance from Barking Dogs

Most residents will I am sure agree with me that dog owners who leave their dogs outside for hours at a time whilst they are at work or shopping and which result in these dogs barking sometimes continuously for long periods of time are being unreasonable to both the dogs and their neighbours.

During my delivering and collection of the recent Parish Plan survey, I saw and heard this nuisance barking at first hand and would urge all dog owners to please be considerate to their neighbours and not allow dogs natural barking to become a nuisance to neighbours. It is perhaps important to realise that excessive barking outside particularly suburban properties, where several nearby home owners will be affected, can be regarded as an actionable nuisance by environmental health departments.

Parish Plan Survey

Talking of this survey, I must thank the Parish Council led by Chairman John Pullen for the thoroughness of the process to gain residents opinions on future housing need and development in Northwood. I understand at least 50% have been returned completed which will enable the Parish Council to make a strongly supported case for any future housing developments in Northwood as the present Island Plan is further developed. I do indeed thank residents for their co-operation in this important survey.

Important Replacement Electricity Supply on A3020

I have been informed that Southern Electricity need to undertake a major renewal of the electricity supply along this road from Noke Common over eight weeks on Monday to Friday ending on 28th March or sooner if possible. The works will be between 9am and 4pm (outside of the rush hours). The nature of the works means that traffic will be controlled by "Stop - Go" boards although there may be a few occasions when temporary traffic lights will be needed. May I remind residents that statutory undertakers like the
