

Planning; Asphalt Plant, Medina Wharf

Councillors all confirmed that they were in receipt of the two emails from a local resident setting out her representations to the application.

That following consideration of the additional information submitted by the applicant in response to the original request from the Local Planning Authority, councillors confirmed that they felt it unnecessary to discuss the application further as the situation remained unchanged and that the response to the re-advertised application would be that of the original approved resolution:

"That this Parish Council strenuously opposes the application TCP/30985 for a proposed





asphalt plant, together with associated facilities on the following grounds:

An unacceptable increase in traffic and associated noise/pollution, in particular in the area of Arctic Road. The danger posed by emissions in an increasingly populated area. Past planning history (refusal for a development of a similar nature). The potential for pollution/damage to the River Medina.

The lack of an independent Environmental Study. The nuisance to residents over a wide area from odorous emissions. Noise pollution, Loss of visual amenity to local residents. Conflict with the Eco Island strategy. The threat to future inward investment, with particular regard to good guality housing and 'High end' industry".

Following comments made by a few local dog walkers over the lack of seating along the cycle track. Cllr Fuller had undertaken initial investigations into the feasibility of providing some provision at strategic points. He suggested the possible installation of inexpensive, robust concrete seating. Sources of potential funds were highlighted. However, further work was required to determine the actual costs involved for the seats and their installation, and also as to whether approval would be required from the I.W. Council.

Councillors in discussion on this subject suggested that there was also a need for additional dog litter bins along the cycle track.

our Members of the Working Party had met with planning officers at the Seaclose Office. A general discussion had taken place with regard to the need or otherwise for a Northwood tell Neighbourhood Plan. The decision to inform parishioners fully of the identified Strategic Please Housing Land Availability Assessment (SHLAA) sites and to consult in connection with the outlook for the future of Northwood was covered in some detail; as was the style of questionnaires which might be used and method for distribution/collection.

The importance to align any action with the Area Action Plan (AAP) was considered to be vital. One route that could be followed would be to use the help offered by planners and produce a revised Parish Plan, in tandem with their AAP. The Working Party had agreed this to be the most effective and efficient way forward. The Senior Planning Officer, Mr Ollie Boulter requested that meetings on a regular basis should take place to ensure both parties continue to work in compliance.

Discussion ensued on how best to commence the process and the next steps to be taken. Attached to the agenda was a suggested letter that could be circulated, with also a map depicting the sites, to all residents apprising of the 13 potential SHLAA sites in Northwood.

However, it was reported that Gurnard Parish Council had recently circulated a questionnaire requesting local residents' views on the long term future of their area. Councillors considered the advantages of providing a similar copy, as the initial step forward. By customising this questionnaire the parish council would be able to determine the local community's view on the sort of place they would like Northwood to be, in the vears ahead: how land should be used and developed in the village, the size or type of buildings that was felt acceptable and establish the demand for local housing needed for those living or working in the Parish. This information was essential in the production of a comprehensive Parish Plan.

Safer Neighbourhood Report for Northwood

The Life and Responsibilities of a Northwood Churchwarden in the Eighteenth Century

more. The wardens were at the centre of life in the parish at this time, together with much the Minister, Overseers of the Poor, the Waywardens and Church Vestry. They described themselves proudly as Yeomen in the Parish Records and included men such as Biles, Trickett, Cole and Heal. Their duties were many and and various. The churchwardens were responsible for keeping order during events services and evicting dogs from the church. The boundaries of the parish were their responsibility and stones were laid at the appropriate places. In 1702 the walking of the bounds reported that these stones were still laid twenty years and before. The wardens, who met at the Flower Pot Public House were also responsible for the administration of the church charities namely the Mann, news Smith and Cole Trusts. This usually resulted in the apprenticeship of a poor boy and could either mean in him learning a very good trade, often in London, local or being used as cheap labour. Later in the century the wealthy of the parish (usually farmers) were obliged to take a child from the workhouse. Refusal latest | meant the risk of a fine. Wardens paid parish expenses, raised from the rates and these included such varied items as payment for 6 Hedgehogs (2 the shillings), 13 dozen sparrows heads (2 shillings), new stocks, painted and with a lock £3. 8s. 7d. All the parishes at this time had to keep a cannon, and in 1780 the cannon had to be taken to Newport and returned to the parish, at a www.northwoodvillage.org.uk cost of 10s 6d. Marriage then was cheaper than today, costing in total 18 shillings. To bury someone cost 6s 8d if they were a stranger or 3s 4d if the person was a soldier or classified as poor. Suicides were often not buried in the graveyard but elsewhere. If they were interred in the graveyard, it was usually on the North side of the church on a north/south axis. In 1786 the wardens claimed £22 5s 6d in expenses for "presenting William Mack, a carter, at Winton for the murder of a soldier". The general repair of the church and gravevard was the responsibility of the wardens. The Church wall. windows and gate were repaired at this time. The sexton was responsible for the repair of Church linen and grave digging. The above gives you a taster of what the duties of a warden were three hundred years ago. Personally I am relieved that we are no longer required to do many of them. However, other things have taken their place and I regard it as a great honour to be following Visit the village website: in their footsteps.

Proposed Changes to Council Tax Benefit

The coalition government is ending the current scheme - which it funds - and asking each local authority to formulate a local council tax support scheme to replace the present costly scheme which has risen over the past decade by I think over £10,000,000,000 (£10billion). So the government is also reducing the amount it provides to fund this benefit, leaving in our case a shortfall estimated at £1.9m.

The scheme my Cabinet colleagues and I considered for public consultation requires all those currently in receipt of council tax benefit to pay at least some part of their council tax bill. However pensioners and those residents who face additional barriers to employment such as the disabled or those with mental impairment would continue to receive this benefit as before.

NEW Our view was that this approach coupled with ending relief for second home owners was fairer than either transferring the entire burden of the £1.9m shortfall onto those who already pay the charge in full; increasing council tax or reducing services.

NORTHWOOD The whole Council will be considering this approach on 19th September and subject to that decision a full public consultation will be launched on 24th September. Given the widespread scope of the options and their potential impact, I will be urging residents to take part. I will also be reporting on this again ⊆. in the next Northwood News and in my report to Northwood Parish Council in them October.

This planning application was re-advertised on 31st August with 21 days to make further comments. Again I am confident that residents who have concerns about several aspects of this complex application will make those known or indeed will repeat the concerns they have already expressed. I hope the Case Officer's report will be available during October. It will be published as a public www. document and I will be pleased to meet with residents at County Hall before the Committee meets (or earlier if required) to discuss my view of any recommendations contained in the report. website:


CHURCH ANNOUNCEMENT
